BSA Space's 6th Annual Gingerbread Design exhibition: "Innovations and Firsts", celebrating 150 years of Boston as a hub of innovation.

December 11–31, 2017

(Boston, December 7, 2017)— [BSA Space's 6th Annual Gingerbread Design exhibition](#) will display masterful culinary follies by local architecture and landscape architecture firms from Boston and elsewhere in Massachusetts. This year, 15 teams will explore the theme: "Innovations and Firsts." The sweet renditions will celebrate 150 years of Boston as a hub of innovation.

Launched in 2012, the annual Gingerbread House Design exhibition raises funds for the public programs of the BSA Foundation.

Visitors can see the designs in person at BSA Space December 11 – 31, 2017, or online at gingerbread.cdrcboston.org where they can vote by bidding for their favorite designs. Donations of any size are welcome, and all donations count. All donations are tax-deductible and support the public programs of the BSA Foundation, a 501(c)3 nonprofit. The design that generates the most total donations will be declared the winner and announced at a closing reception on December 18. Also recognized will be the house that receives the highest number of bids. Guest "celebrity" judges Brendan Ciecko (Founder, Cuseum), Louise Kennedy (Senior Arts Producer, WBUR), and Sarah Kennedy (Service Manager, No.9 Park) will be presenting a few more whimsical awards to their favorite constructions. The exhibition and reception are free and open to the public. The exhibition is open Monday through Friday, 10am–6pm, weekends and holidays 10am–5pm.
