**Overhaul: The 2013-2014 Transportation Series**

October 2013 – June 2014

The Boston Society of Architects announces **Overhaul: The 2013-2014 Transportation Series**, an expansive series of design exhibitions, lectures, and other programs offering the region's most comprehensive look at urban-transportation visioning in Greater Boston.

Overhaul includes design exhibition ***Rights of Way: Mobility and the City*** and the authoritative speaker series **Traffic Advisory**.

**Traffic Advisory**, running through June 2014, will mine sustainable transportation opportunities that support the Boston Transportation Department's 2014 visioning process. The City of Boston, led by a new administration, plans to set policy that ensures every Bostonian will work and reside within a quarter mile of a transit station, bike share, and car share while reducing vehicle miles traveled by 7.5 percent in seven years. These changes may result in increasing foot, transit, and bike use to two-thirds for all city trips by 2030. Traffic Advisory brings together leading regional, national, and international policy makers, architects, engineers, researchers, and planners to frame Boston's mobility challenges and prospects in this new era of economic, climate, and social transformation. It features lively speakers presenting content that is relevant and relatable to individual citizens, business owners, professionals, students, teachers, and policy makers. All events are free and open to the public and held at BSA Space, 290 Congress Street, unless otherwise noted. ***Rights of Way: Mobility and the City*** (December 5, 2013–May 26, 2014) is a global exploration of mobility and transportation in cities. The exhibition will feature dozens of examples of visionary urban thinking, showing how the city is shaped by the ways people move through it. Curated by James Graham and Meredith Miller of MILLIGRAM-office, ***Rights of Way*** will demonstrate that our urban environment is the result of constant negotiation among designers, policy makers, the private sector, and individual residents. Displays will include renderings, drawings, photography, videos, infographics, and an interactive media library that will allow visitors to delve further into the issues raised by the exhibition content. Urban adventurers, professionals, academics, students, policy makers, and families alike will be inspired to add their voices to the transportation dialogue. ***Rights of Way*** will also feature various international urban prototypes and mobility strategies suitable for the city of Boston today.
