### ***Awards Categories***

Accessible Design; Education Facilities Design; John M. Clancy Award for Socially Responsible Housing; Sustainable Design; Unbuilt Architecture and Design; Honor Awards for Design Excellence; and the Harleston Parker Medal.

### ***Award Hierarchy***

***Honor Awards:*** the highest awards. These projects are the “best of the best.” Each one elevated the hearts and minds of our juries by expressing both technical and aesthetic design excellence.

***Awards:*** admirable and innovative work that is successfully executed from concept through construction.

***Citations:*** those projects that caught the jury’s eye for design, technical, humanitarian or other reasons, but which were not formally awarded.

### **The Harleston Parker Medal**

The Harleston Parker Medal award was established in 1921 by J. Harleston Parker in memory of his father. The first award was granted by the BSA in 1923. The intent of the award is to acknowledge the most beautiful piece of architecture, building, monument, or structure within the City of Boston or Metropolitan Parks District limits.

### **People Choice Award**

An online competition organized by the BSA and hosted by Boston.com where members of the public go head to head with the 2013 Harleston Parker Medal jury to decide which among this year's finalists the most beautiful building in Boston is. The winner is announced at the BSA Design Award Gala.
